SUBJECT: APPROVE A SECOND AMENDMENT WITH FLOCK SAFETY FOR THE AUTOMATIC LICENSE PLATE READER SYSTEM AND SUPPORTING SOFTWARE SERVICES

Dear Board Members:

RECOMMENDATION:

- A. Approve a second amendment (Procurement Contract No. 25630) between the County of Alameda and Flock Safety (Principal: Tory Kornblum; Location: Atlanta, Georgia), for Flock Safety to provide the Automatic License Plate Reader (ALPR) system and related software services, extending the contract period of 7/1/23 – 6/30/25 to a retroactive period ending on 6/30/26 (a one-year extension) and increasing the contract amount from \$550,600 to \$854,200 (an increase of \$303,600); and
- B. Adopt a resolution waiving the competitive procurement process for this second amendment.

DISCUSSION/SUMMARY:

In July 2023, the Sheriff's Office (ACSO) entered into a piggyback contract for Flock Safety's Automatic License Plate Reader system in the unincorporated areas of Alameda County. The original piggyback contract was through the San Jose Police Department. On 6/27/23, your Board approved the original agreement (Item No. 63) with Flock Safety which covered the period from 7/1/23-6/30/24. On 8/6/24, your Board approved the first amendment (item 83) which extended the term to 6/30/25. This second amendment will extend the contract through the current fiscal year to 6/30/26. Flock Safety will continue to provide the County of Alameda with the ALPR system, maintenance, upgrades, and technical services.

On April 22, 2025, your Board approved Item #35 with Flock Safety for the Pan Tilt Zoom Video Camera system. On July 8, 2025, your Board approved Item #78 with Flock Safety for the AeroDome DFR (Drone as First Responder) system, which further integrated vital technology into the ACSO Real Time Information Center.

The ALPR technology has been extremely beneficial since it was implemented by ACSO. The use of the system has led to the arrest of violent offenders, an increased number of recovered stolen vehicles, and a significant decrease in violent and overall crime. The ACSO has also seen a drastic increase in the number of crimes solved with the aid of the ALPR technology. Per the terms of the contract, the data captured by the ALPR cameras is owned by the Alameda County Sheriff's Office. The ACSO follows all state laws and contract language to ensure the retention and purging of collected data conforms with state law and ACSO General Order 5.42 (Automated License Plate

Recognition System). The ACSO, with consultation from the Office of County Counsel, completed a review of G.O. 5.42 to ensure compliance with all applicable California statutes.

The Flock Safety ALPR cameras are the only law enforcement grade ALPR system that offers proprietary features, seamlessly integrating multiple technology systems that have increased the ability for public safety response and solving crimes. These features include modifications to ensure compliance with California law and transparency portals. The Flock cameras are also solar powered, which allow for flexible installation without the need for additional infrastructure. There is no change to the scope of services. Due to inflation, the cost for servicing each camera has increased. Therefore, the annual software cost has increased.

SELECTION CRITERIA/PROCESS:

Flock Safety is the sole manufacturer and developer of the Flock Safety ALPR camera system and supporting software services. Flock Safety is also the sole provider of comprehensive monitoring, processing, and machine vision services which integrate with the Flock Safety ALPR camera system.

The City of San Jose was awarded a contract with Flock Safety to use and purchase the ALPR technology through a competitive bidding process. The ACSO contacted the City of San Jose and worked with GSA to obtain a piggyback authorization. On 5/4/23, the General Services Agency approved Piggyback Acceptance No. 9089 for the Sheriff's Office, which is only valid through 4/30/26. This amendment ends as of 6/30/26, which is two months after the expiration of the approved Piggyback. Therefore, we are requesting to waive the competitive bid process.

Flock Safety is the only vendor that has the knowledge and expertise to provide complete compatibility and fully integrated ALPR services. There are no other vendors in Alameda County that can provide similar services of this quality. On 12/19/25, the Office of Acquisition Policy (OAP) approved SLEB waiver #27942, which is valid through 6/30/26, for ACSO to select Flock Safety to provide the ALPR system and supporting services.

FINANCING:

Funding for this request is not included in ACSO's Fiscal Year 25-26 Approved Budget. Through increased appropriations authorized by the Board on 12/9/25 (Item 74), all costs associated with this request will be fully offset by the 2026 Citizen's Option for Public Safety Frontline funding awarded by the State of California. There will be no increase in net County cost as a result of your approval.

FOR FLOCK SAFETY TO PROVIDE THE ALPR SYSTEM AND SUPPORTING SOFTWARE
SERVICES FOR THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE**

RESOLUTION NUMBER R-2026 _____

WHEREAS, the County of Alameda wishes to amend an agreement with Flock Safety to provide the Automatic License Plate Reader system and supporting software services and extend the original contract period of 7/1/23 – 6/30/25 to the retroactive contract period from 7/1/25 to 6/30/26; and

WHEREAS, the contract amount is increased from \$550,600 to \$854,200 (an increase of \$303,600); and

WHEREAS, the Flock Safety ALPR system is the only law enforcement grade system that offers proprietary features which include, but are not limited to, vehicle fingerprint technology, integrated cloud software and hardware platform, transparency and ethical product design, integrated audio and gunshot detection, and live video integration; and

WHEREAS, the Flock Safety ALPR cameras are solar powered, which allow for flexible installation without the need for additional infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, Flock Safety is the only vendor that has the knowledge and expertise to provide complete compatibility and fully integrated ALPR services, and therefore, a waiver of competitive bidding is appropriate; and

WHEREAS, Alameda County Administrative Code Sections 4.12.010 and 4.12.070 require the solicitation of bids except in unusual cases where the Board of Supervisors ("Board") has, by resolution, found and determined that the public interest would not be served by complying with the bid solicitation process; and

WHEREAS, the County has not found any vendor located within Alameda County that can provide similar services of this quality.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

1. The findings stated in the recitals to this Resolution are restated in full and adopted by reference.
2. The requirements in Administrative Code Sections 4.12.010 to 4.12.020 for the solicitation of bids are hereby waived for the selection of Flock Safety.

SECOND AMENDMENT TO STANDARD SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Second Amendment to Agreement (“Second Amendment”) is made by the County of Alameda (“County”) and Flock Group, Inc, (“Contractor”) with respect to that certain Standard Services Agreement entered by them on July 1, 2023 (referred to herein as the “Agreement”) pursuant to which Contractor provides Automatic License Plate Reader system and services to County.

County and Contractor, for valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, agree as follows:

1. Except as otherwise stated in this Second Amendment, the terms and provisions of this Second Amendment will be effective as of the date this Second Amendment is executed by the County (“Effective Date”).
2. The term of the Agreement is currently scheduled to expire on June 30, 2025. As of the Effective Date, the term of the Agreement is extended through June 30, 2026.
3. In consideration for Contractor’s additional services, the County shall pay Contractor in an additional amount not to exceed Three Hundred Three Thousand Six Hundred dollars (\$303,600). As a result of these additional services, the not to exceed amount has increased from Five Hundred Fifty Thousand Six Hundred dollars (\$550,600) to Eight Hundred Fifty-Four Thousand Two Hundred dollars (\$854,200) over the term of the Agreement and any amendments.
4. Page 1 of the Agreement has been amended by changing the shall not exceed amount in the last sentence to \$854,200
5. Item 3 of Exhibit B is deleted and replaced with the following:


Total payment under the terms of this Agreement will not exceed the total amount of \$854,200. This cost includes all taxes and all other charges.

7. Except as expressly modified by this First Amendment, all of the terms and conditions of the Agreement are and remain in full force and effect.

In July 2025, a victim returned to his home in San Lorenzo after withdrawing money from a bank in Hayward. As he approached his front door, two suspects, both armed with handguns attempted to rob him. During the incident, the suspects shot the victim in the leg. Private security video footage captured the suspect vehicle but no license plate. Flock Safety Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) cameras and the victim identified a white 2021 Toyota Camry that showed the suspect vehicle following the victim from the bank in Hayward to his residence in San Lorenzo, where the robbery and shooting occurred. The suspects were ultimately arrested!



Case Study

San Lorenzo

In December 2022, a fatal shooting occurred in Castro Valley. Although several private security cameras captured images of the suspect vehicle, investigators were initially unable to determine the vehicle's make, model, or license plate number.

Investigators then utilized Flock Safety Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) cameras to confirm the vehicle's license plate and place it in the area at the time of the homicide. Information obtained during that interview led to the identification and subsequent arrest of the suspect.



Case Study

Castro Valley

In December 2025, ACSO arrested a suspect in possession of explicit images of unidentified minors on his phone. An investigation by the Special Victims Unit was conducted however the suspect posted bail and was released from custody.

Special Victims Unit detectives continued the investigation and identified children victims depicted in the images recovered from the suspect's phone, some of whom were the suspect's own children. An arrest warrant was quickly obtained from a judge given the serial nature and severity of the offenses.

At that time, the suspect's whereabouts were unknown.

Detectives entered the suspect's vehicle into the Flock Safety Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) system, and the Real Time Information Center (RTIC) was notified. Approximately 1 hour and 26 minutes after the vehicle was entered, RTIC received an alert indicating the vehicle had been located. Patrol was directed to the area and quickly arrested the suspect vehicle at a hotel in Hayward.

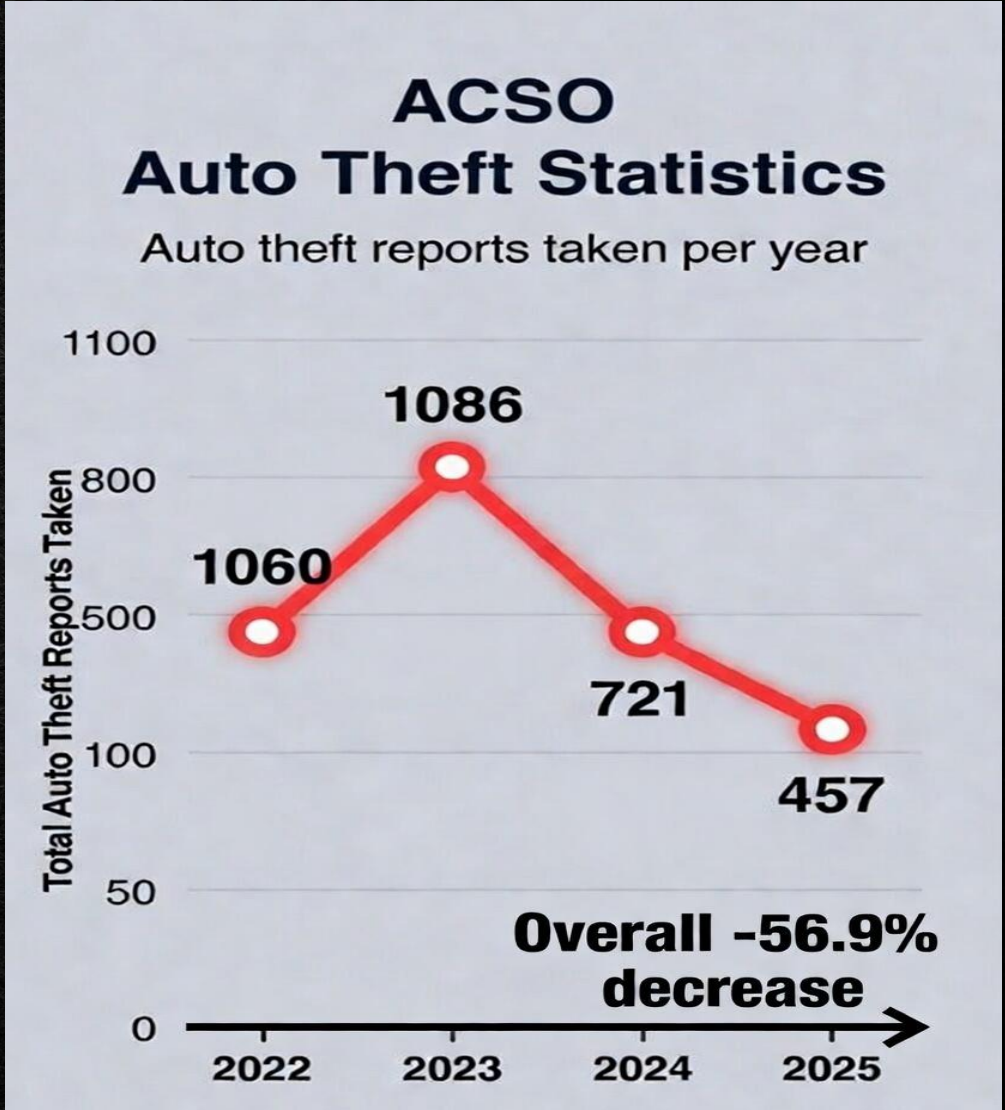
